Meet Kenney Tran, Manager of Your Neighborhood Walmart "What's really cool is that Walmart

"The biggest reward whenever we're in a leadership role is to actually give back to the community, because we're in the right position to actually do that, but not only that—it's just worthwhile to be able to help out the community, because if we operate in it, we should be great neighbors and also help out those who work and live there too," said Kenney Tran when asked about his personal philosophy.

It's clear that what Tran says comes from the heart and his intent to follow through on his commitment to the community in which he serves is without question.

Tran was born and raised in San Diego, California. He attended San Diego State University for both his undergrad and graduate studiespolitical science.

Tran began his latest position with Walmart as store manager of the Rosemead location in November of 2016. Prior to his post in Rosemead, Tran served as Walmart's Human Resource manager for the San Francisco Bay area. Prior to his work up north, Tran served as the store manager for the Downtown Los Angeles/Chinatown Walmart—serving as that location's store manager for 3 years. Despite his busy work schedule, Tran is strongly dedicated to charity and community events. Tran is a member of Team Red, White & Blue—a veterans' organization. Team Red, White & Description organization. Blue's mission is 'to enrich the lives of America's veterans by connecting them to their community through physical and social activity.'

"I was previously part of the San Jose-San Francisco chapter, but since I moved back, I have been in touch with the chapter here in Los Angeles and on July 4, we are actually going to be doing an Eagle Charge run," Tran said. has sponsored this run every year and this year Walmart is going to sponsor it again, so team RWB and Walmart have a pretty great partnership right now, and I found that it was the perfect opportunity for me to get my store involved, and also to do a run through Rosemead right before the [July 4] parade."

Running has been a big part of Tran's life for many years—throughout his career with Walmart as well as during and prior to his career in the military.

"I used to love running and then I joined the military and running was definitely a great pastime for me," Tran said. "I was in the army reserves for almost 11 years and I just recently left the army reserves last April (2016). I left as a captain and I was in the medical service corps and my unit was stationed right outside of Riverside in Moreno Valley."

During his military career, Tran has traveled across the country—from Oklahoma to Texas. Tran has also served in missions in Guatemala and

"They were humanitarian missions," Tran said. "I was part of a medical unit. I went down there to provide medical care to young ... local populations down there and to help them build different types of structures. I did the actual coordinating of my unit in terms of the people processing and also leading my soldiers out in foreign countries."

Tran is currently on the lookout to start some of his own humanitarian missions here in Rosemead.

"I have been reaching out to the Rosemead Chamber and also the City Council to get a lot more involved," Tran said. "Since I just moved back... We just recently gave a grant donation and actually attended the event for Familia Unida—an organization that helps out a lot of families here in Rosemead."

Founded in 1998 and based in East Los Angeles as the first MS organization in the United States to reach out to the Spanish-speaking community, Familia Unida has expanded to include support to anyone who is living with a disability, chronic illness and/or low income immigrants facing similar challenges. The organization holds monthly support groups at the Rosemead Community Center on the last Friday of each month. For more information about Familia Unida, visit lovefamiliaunida.org.

"In addition to that, I've been reaching out to different schools, different organizations—to see what I can do to not only be a representative of Walmart, but also to be a great community partner that everybody respects too," Tran said.

Tran says it's important to work closely with other business members within the community to figure out solutions to issues such as the increase in homelessness. He says that for businesses to actually address it, the entire community needs to come together and find out the best way to generate solutions.

Working together with the community and giving back to the community is very important to Tran.

"It's our duty to help out the neediest people and the most vulnerable people too," Tran said. He added: "We must foster not only a community where we're supporting and also helping [to reduce] homelessness, but also driving a common theme [throughout]."

Tran explained that as a Walmart store, their goal is to be not just great business partners in the community, but also great community partners as



To enroll your child in **Kindergarten**, your child must turn 5 years old by December 3, 2016 through September 1, 2017. You **MUST** enroll your student in your school of residency.


